2003-2004 YEAR IN REVIEW ANOTHER GREAT YEAR!



FROM CLUB TIME TRIALS TO THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC TRIALS
AND OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC GAMES,
UVPCS ATHLETES AND COACHES ENJOYED ANOTHER TERRIFIC YEAR.

During the 2003-2004 swim season UVic-PCS Association swimmers attended thirty-five meets in three provinces and three countries, spanning club time trials and regional all-level meets to the Olympic and Paralympic Games in Athens. We placed fifth and third respectively at the Provincial Age-Group Short Course Championships in February and the Provincial Age-Group Long Course Championships in July. At the Long Course Club Nationals in August the UVPCS team placed seventh in Canada; we were the highest ranked Vancouver I sland team and third amongst BC teams attending the meet.

MEETS

In December we hosted our Second Annual Christmas Cracker Meet, which was a thriller even before the first race owing to the on-again, off-again strike at BC Ferries. Despite consequent travel difficulties, teams attended from the BC Mainland and Alberta, as well as Vancouver Island, and Saanich Commonwealth Place saw some fast swimming, including a Canadian Record and a Provincial Record set by UBC Dolphins relay teams. January saw UVPCS hosting a very successful Vancouver Island Regional Short Course Championships, and, shortly after the VIRs, the Canada West University Championships. In July, after a few months' break, we hosted the Provincial Open Age-Group Long Course Championships, with 400+ swimmers from thirty-nine teams. We thank our coaches, members, volunteers, friends and sponsors who've worked to make all our meets successful for the swimmers; we are especially grateful to officials from across the province who generously volunteer their time on the pool deck.

ACHIEVEMENTS


Our swimmers practised consistently and steadily throughout the year, with true discipline and dedication, through regular workouts, and at swim camps in Victoria, California (B-group) and Florida and Texas (A-group). All that hard work paid off with many new qualifying times, personal bests and meet medals. A few of the year's highlights are as follows:

- At the Canadian Swimming Awards Banquet in November, Karley Stutzel was named Open Water Swimmer of the Year; Stephanie Dixon was awarded Female SWAD Swimmer of the Year, and PCS Head Coach Ron Jacks was National Open Water Coach of the Year. Ron Jacks, Rod Barratt and Vikes Head Coach Peter Vizsolyi each earned Speedo Domestic Excellence Coaching Awards.
- Stephanie Dixon set SWAD World Records in the 200 IM and 400 IM at the Vancouver Island Regional Short Course Championships. She added World Records in the 400 Free and 200 IM (again) at the Western Canadian Championships, and the 100 Backstroke and 400 IM (again) at the short course Canadian Inter-University Championships (CIS). Stephanie qualified for CIS under the able-bodied standards. At the Canadian Olympic Trials Stephanie set another World Record in long course 100 Backstroke. She was awarded the UVic Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year, and the 2003 Ontario Female Athlete with a Disability Award. Stephanie is named to the Canadian Paralympic Team competing in Athens in September 19 26; watch for results on our web site.
- Alyssa Bakken at age 11 was the youngest competitor at the Western Canadian Short Course Championships in February, and set an age group Provincial Record in the 200 Backstroke. Alyssa set a Vancouver Island Regional Age Group Record in the same race at the Provincial Long Course Championships in July.
- Karley Stutzel set a Canada West University Record while winning the 800 Free at the Canada West University Championships; she won bronze in both 400 and 800 Freestyle at the Canadian Inter-University Championships in Toronto.



Ashkaughn both came home with multiple medals, and all five swimmers contributed to the Vancouver Island Zone's winning points score.

At the Canadian Olympic Trials in Toronto, **Nathan O'Brien** won both the 200 Butterfly and the 200 Backstroke (the latter in Provincial Record time) and qualified for the Canadian Olympic Team. Nathan, who holds dual citizenship and attends University in Texas, is a second-generation Olympian for PCS Head Coach Ron Jacks. Ron coached Nathan's mom, Lisa Geary O'Brien, to the 1976 Olympics in Montreal. In Athens Nathan finished 10th in heats and 14th in semi-finals for 200 Backstroke; he also set a personal best time in the 200 Butterfly.



Jayme Weimer, Alyssa Bakken, Nicole Crawford and Craig Dagnall are newly qualified to Youth National standards; Alison Hooper and Brian MacArthur qualified for Club Nationals.

Alyssa Bakken and Nicole Crawford were National Age-Group Champions at Long Course Club Nationals. Medalists at that meet also included Alison Hooper, Craig Dagnall, Hollis Roth, Karley Stutzel, David Creel, Christin Petelski, Jesse Jacks, and the Men's Open Freestyle Relay team of David Creel, Greer Jacks,





- * Karley Stutzel and David Creel have been selected to represent Canada at the 2004 FINA World Open Water Championship Trials to be held September 11, 2004 in Atlantic City, USA.
- Penny McCullouch-Barratt once again directed a terrific Elementary School Swim Program in a number of Greater Victoria schools.
- ♦ Many UVPCS athletes were also Regional and Provincial medalists, and we sported lots of new AA and AAA qualifiers throughout the year.

- ❖ The Lightning Fast Swim Series, designed by UVPCS coaches, was launched in September in partnership with Saanich Commonwealth Place, and at UVic in the Spring. This innovative series introduces young swimmers to competitive swimming.
- ❖ In October, the University of Victoria Pacific Coast Swimming Association (UVPCS) was formally recognised by Swim BC.
- Meet Manager and Senior Officials' Chair Margaret Penning qualified as an SNC Level IV Official.
- May's Silent Auction Fundraiser wasn't just terrifically successful, it was also a lot of fun.
- The Masri Family graciously hosted a wonderful End of Season Barbeque on a beautiful evening in early July.
