# 2005 Canadian National Club Championships #1 British Columbia Team, #4 in Canada

FROM CLUB TIME TRIALS TO THE WORLD AQUATICS CHAMPIONSHIPS, OUR ATHLETES AND COACHES ENJOYED ANOTHER TERRIFIC YEAR.





During the 2004-2005 swim season swimmers and coaches from the University of Victoria Pacific Coast Swimming Association (UVPCS) attended forty-one meets in four provinces and four countries, spanning club time trials and regional all-level meets to the World Aquatic Championships in Montreal and FISU Games in Turkey. Our team placed fourth at the Provincial Age-Group Short Course Championships in February. At the Long Course National Club Championships in July the UVPCS team placed fourth in Canada – and we were the #1 team from British Columbia.

#### **MEETS**

In December we hosted our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Christmas Cracker Meet, which continues to grow in number of swimmers and teams attending, not to mention Santa himself dispensing prizes, elves handing out Christmas Crackers during heats, and a general seasonal spirit of fun and fierce competition. This year we also hosted the Provincial Short Course AAA Championships, and Meets Director Margaret Penning and everyone who worked the meet justly earned high praise – the meet ran without a hitch in a spirit of generosity and courtesy. Congratulations team! Finally, in early June we presented our Wavemaker Invitational, designed exclusively for 12 and under swimmers, who rarely experience a meet that includes heats and finals. It was a resounding success and promises to be even better next year. One US competitor commented: All in all, I think that meet was one of the most fun meets I've ever been to. Everyone was very nice and had very good sportsmanship. For example, at the end of each of my races, my competitor in the next lane, and I, exchanged "Good Jobs" with each other, and after one race we shook hands. Hopefully, next year everyone will come, because this meet is such a good experience, and so much fun! We thank our coaches, members, volunteers, friends and sponsors who've worked to make all our meets successful for the swimmers; we are especially grateful to officials from across the province who generously volunteer their time on the pool deck.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

UVPCS swimmers practised consistently and steadily throughout the year, with true discipline and dedication, through regular workouts, and at swim camps in Victoria and California. All that hard work paid off with many new qualifying times, personal bests and meet medals. Here are a few of the year's highlights:



- At our annual Awards Night in October, winners were Kristina Phillips and Evan Letkeman (10 and under), Alyssa Bakken and Tyler Smith (11-12), Nicole Crawford and David Vizsolyi (13-14), Hollis Roth and Greer Jacks (15-17) and Stephanie Dixon and Nathan O'Brien (Senior). Awards are given for the highest IPS point swim in each age group during the preceding season.
- UVPCS swimmers and coaches also garnered honours at the Canadian Swimming Awards Banquet in November 2004, hosted by Swimming Canada and the Canadian Swim Coaches and Teachers Association. Karley Stutzel won 2004 Canadian Open Swimmer of the Year and Nathan O'Brien was named the 2004 Canadian Male Backstroke Swimmer of the Year. UVPCS Head Coach Ron Jacks won the 2004 Canadian Open Water Coach of the Year Award. Ron also picked up a Petro-Canada Coaching Excellence Award (awarded to coaches whose athletes won medals over the past year at Open World Championships, Olympic Games, Special Olympics World Games, or Paralympic Games see below for Stephanie Dixon's achievements), and both Ron and coach Rod Barratt were honoured with Speedo Domestic Excellence in Coaching Awards.
- Rachael Besler, Salin Bol, Connor Bryan, Ben Carriere, Kelsey Elliot, Caleigh Filmer, Katherine Fretz, Zoe Hopkins, Jack Jones, Nadia Masri and Lauren Sheeran (10 and under); Renee Barone, Brittany Fox and Karlee Olmer (11-12); Robert Mayall and Jana Murphy (13-14); Chemene Gybels, Bernadette Simas and Lynn Wang (15+) all achieved their first age-group Regional A qualifying times.
- Jason Bradbury, Niv Hack and Aidan Thirkell (10 and under); Cole Barratt, Jamie Bennett and Bronte Wakefield (11-12); Jordan Gybels and Kristin McKinney (13-14); and Jeff Phillips, Monica Pinette and Lowell Rockcliffe (15+) achieved their first age-group Regional AA qualifying times.
- Genna Bertrand, Evan Letkeman and Brendan Ward achieved their first Regional 10 and under AAA qualifying times.
- Kristina Phillips (11-12), Andrea Vizsolyi (13-14) and Kurtis Vallee (15+) achieved their first Provincial age-group AAA qualifying times.
- Julia Schmidt (12 and under); Nicholas Sinclair and Tyler Smith (13 and under); Jacob McKee and William Yolland (14) and Mary-Claire Zachernuk (Open) achieved their first Club National age-group/open qualifying times.
- Alison Hooper, Jovanna Ruffolo and David Vizsolyi achieved their first Youth National/Western qualifying times.
- Nicole Crawford and Alyssa Bakken achieved their first Senior National qualifying times.
- Swim BC selected its Provincial Teams for the Short Course (25m) Season, and Alyssa Bakken, Nicole Crawford, Hollis Roth, Ryan Clouston and Mackenzie Downing were named to the Age Group (12 and under), Prospects (13-14), Youth (15-16) and Junior (18 and under) Teams. In March, Swim BC named its Long Course (50m) Provincial Teams, and once again UVPCS was well represented by Alyssa Bakken, Nicole Crawford, Jayme Weimer, David Vizsolyi, Hollis Roth and Mackenzie Downing.
- Coach Rod Barratt was named Swim BC 14 and Under Head Coach during the long course season, and coached the eightmember Age Group Prospects Swim BC Select Team (ages 14 and under) to 17 Gold, 12 Silver, and 4 Bronze Medals amid stiff competition at the Far Western Championships in Concord, California in July. UVPCS swimmers Alyssa Bakken, Nicole Crawford and Jayme Weimer were the only Vancouver Island swimmers named to this Provincial team.
- Our Provincial SC medalists in February were Alyssa Bakken, Ryan Clouston, Nicole Crawford, Craig Dagnall, Hollis Roth and Jayme Weimer; July's LC Provincial medalists were Jovanna Ruffolo, Julia Schmidt and Nick Sinclair.
- At Club Nationals in July, our medalists were Alyssa Bakken,



Nicole Crawford, Stephanie Dixon, Mackenzie Downing, Nathan O'Brien, Nicholas Sinclair, and Jayme Weimer; and our finalists were Craig Dagnall, Hollis Roth, Julia Schmidt, Tyler Smith and David Vizsolyi. As well, the Girls' 14 and under 400 Freestyle Relay team, consisting of Jayme Weimer, Alyssa Bakken, Jovanna Ruffolo and Nicole Crawford won the Gold medal and set a new Provincial Record in the process. Finally, but definitely not least, UVPCS Single Age Club National Champions were Alyssa Bakken (200 and 400 IM, 100 and 200 Backstroke) and Nicole Crawford (400 and 800 Freestyle).

Alyssa Bakken was busy this year setting Provincial Records in the 11-12 Girls' SC 100 and 200 Backstroke, and LC 100 Freestyle, 100 Backstroke, and 200 and 400 Individual Medley. She finished the year at Far Westerns in California in July with a National Age Group (12 and under) LC Record in the 200 Backstroke!



Stephanie Dixon spent the year winning awards and medals, and setting World Records.


Representing Canada at the Paralympics, Stephanie competed in eight events (six individual and two relays) and came home with eight medals, including Gold and an S9 World Record in the 100 LC Backstroke. She also won medals for Canada at the inaugural International Paralympic World Cup Meet and the British Disability Championships in England in May, and the US National Paralympic Championships in July. Stephanie set three S9 SC




World Records at the Canadian Interuniversity Sport (CIS) Championships and twice lowered the 200 LC Backstroke S9 World Record, in Vancouver in March and in Winnipeg at Club Nationals in July. In January she was named to the 2004 list of the most influential women in sport and physical activity by the Canadian Association for the Advancement of Women and Sport and Physical Activity (CAAWS); in March she was named the

Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year at the University of Victoria and SportBC's Disabled Athlete of the Year; and in April Stephanie was named Victoria's Female Athlete of the Year, and was one of the recipients of the Premier's Athletics

Karley Stutzel represented Canada at the Speedo 10K for the USA Open Water Championships in September, the FINA World Open Water Championships in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates in November, the USA Open Water National Championships in June, and the FINA World Aquatic Championships in Montreal in July. At Worlds, Karley was one of only a handful of swimmers, male or female, who qualified to race in all three Open Water events: the 5k, 10k and 25k swims. She finished 14th in the 5k, 15th in the 10k and 12th in the 25k. Karley was also the recipient of the University of Victoria Chancellor's Award, given







David Creel represented Canada at the Speedo 10K for the USA Open Water Championships in September, the FINA World Open Water Championships in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates in November and the USA Open Water National Championships in June. Dave was also a finalist at the CIS Championships and the Canadian World Aquatics Trials.





- Jesse Jacks won Gold in the 200 Butterfly at Canadian Open Short Course Championships in December. Unfortunately, Jesse injured his wrist in January, and missed the rest of the season. We look forward to his entirely healthy return!
- Nathan O'Brien, an Athens Olympian, spends the academic year in Texas. He returned to Canada and UVPCS to swim at the Canadian World Aquatics Trials and won Bronze in the 100 Backstroke. Nathan also won three medals at Club Nationals in July Gold for Open 100 and 200 Backstroke, and Silver in 50 Backstroke.
- Head Coach Ron Jacks was the 2004-2005 Canadian Open Water Head Coach and Open Water Head Coach at the FINA World Aquatic Championships. He was also a coach with the Canadian Paralympic Team in Athens.
- Coaches Rod Barratt, Mark Lancaster and Ron Jacks, and Penny McCullouch-Barratt, once again offered a terrific Elementary School Swim Program in a number of Greater Victoria schools.
